of over \$3,800.00. The Shoebox Ladies are grateful for

We just started our packing parties on Oct 7th with Kings Table (Abundant Life) packing the 5 to 9 Girls boxes of 150. October 8th, King's Kids packed 150 boxes of the 5 to 9 Boys.

Next week (October 15th) XYZ will be packing the 10 to 14 Boys & Girls for a total of 300 boxes, and the Youth will pack October 22nd 300 boxes for 2 to 4 Boys and Girls.

The ladies have put time all year in gathering items for the boxes, counting and recounting to make sure we have a good box of clothing, hygiene, school supplies and "wow" gifts.

November 18th we will deliver our boxes to our pickup center for our area at Crossway Baptist Church. Those will be loaded in 18 wheelers and sent to different processing centers. Dallas is our closest processing warehouse. We already have reservations to go December 8th to the warehouse to make sure boxes are customs ready to go to
